Click on the "on-line registration – click here" link to take you directly to the official Festival reservation site. Be sure to use this link to be able to get the Festival rates for your stay. OR use your cell phone to scan this handy QR code which will take you directly to the Glenmore Inn Festival registration link. (NSRDC is us!) Once you indicate how many adults, click "update guests & rooms" and it will take you to a calendar to select your stay dates, then just follow the prompts.

The Glenmore Inn has also made available early check-in dates which include the last few days of the Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth, the Calgary Stampede, July 12 - 14! This will also give you a few days before the Festival or extend you stay after, to take in some of the beautiful sites and attractions in and around Calgary.

THE CALGARY STAMPEDE

The Parade...

Calgary is home to the "Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth", the Calgary Stampede. Unofficially starting the evening of Thursday July 6th with "Sneak-A-Peek", where you can get onto the Stampede grounds the night before the official start of the Stampede.

The official kickoff of the Stampede is Friday July 7 with a HUGE parade through downtown Calgary. The parade starts at 9:00 am with people starting to line the parade route as early as 7:30 am to get a prime location and watch the Parade Prelude entertainment with over 1,500 performers to warm up the crowd. The parade lasts about two hours and after the last horse has passed, head to the grounds for free admission from 11:00 am - 1:30 pm.

- 2022 saw over 305,000 people line the parade route to watch and over 1.109 million people moseyed thru the Stampede grounds during the 10 day show.
- Over 150 western-themed entries including 30 marching bands, 40 floats, 750 horses and 4,000 people marched the parade route.
- Parade Marshalls thru the years have included: last year was Kevin Costner. Actors: William Shatner, Bing Crosby, Bob Hope & Walt Disney. Sports heroes: Nancy Green, Lanny McDonald & Catriona Le May Doan. Singers: Jann Arden, Paul Brandt. Even non-humans: Spuds MacKenzie, the Bud Light beer mascot and Mickey & Minnie Mouse, plus many Indigenous leaders, dancers, chiefs & Canadian Prime Ministers. Even King Charles!

Down on the grounds are many rides for the adrenaline junkies, weird food for the culinary thrill seekers, think ketchup & mustard ice-cream, poutine onion, peanut butter pickle dogs & spicy pickle lemonade. And for those of you who like to press your luck, many games to play and stuffed toys to win.

But Wait There's More! - The art displays, barn yards, world famous chuckwagon races and rodeo plus all of the entertainment like the Coca-Cola Stage, Nashville North, shows, music, attractions - the list goes on... and are a whole 'nother newsletter article so stay tuned!!
